REGISTRATION

Please follow the steps given below to complete your registration.

- Go to the Registrar's Office to get your student number and your payment slip. Please bring your admission letter and requested documents with you. If you have a valid English language qualification that gives you exemption from the English Support Program, please present the original copy at this stage.
- If the necessary payment has already been made, the Registrar's Office will complete your registration.
- If the payment has not been made, go to the bank to make your payment indicating your student number. Then, return to the Registrar's Office with your payment receipt to complete your registration.
- 2. Once you have registered, you will be given access either to sit the EMU English Language Test: Stage 1 (Placement Test) or to take courses from the department.
- 3. Students who have taken the English test and placed into an English course are expected to visit their respective departments to complete their registration.

 please see your advisor immediately.
- Check your payment balance. Please make your payments on the due dates to avoid inconvenience. If there is a problem, go to the accounting office.

^{**} According to a decision taken by the Student Selection and Placement Centre (ÖSYM) on 14.02.2014, IELTS test scores cannot be used for exemption by Turkish citizens.

English Language Requirement

For master's programs that are taught in English and all PhD programs (in English and Turkish), evidence of English language ability is required. If you do not have a valid English language qualification that meets the EMU requirements, your level will be assessed by examination at EMU.

If you have a valid and recognized English language qualification that is not high enough for exemption, you may still use it to register directly to the relevant English course without taking the EMU English Language Tests. EMU English Language Tests

The tests are conducted by the English Preparatory School. Please visit *fleps.emu.edu.tr* and **enter your student number in order to find out the test date, time and exam room**. You may also find sample tests there to study beforehand.

English Language Test: Stage I (Placement Test)

The test consists of 100 multiple choice questions and has four parts; listening, language in use, reading and conversation skills. Each part has four levels; beginner, elementary, pre-intermediate, intermediate.

English Language Test: Stage I Result: AI/A2 - Students who fail to answer correctly at least 60% of beginners and 60% of elementary questions are placed into **ENGL509** Basic Intensive English for Postgraduate Students.

English Language Test: Stage I Result: A2+/BI - Students who answer correctly only 60% of beginners and 60% of elementary questions are placed into **ENGL511** Intensive English for Postgraduate Students.

English Language Test: Stage 2

In order to take the English Language Test: Stage 2, students must answer correctly at least 60% of beginners, 60% of elementary, 60% of pre-intermediate and 60% of intermediate questions in the English Language Test: Stage 1 (Placement Test).

The test has four parts; listening, reading, writing and speaking. The reading and listening parts have multiple choice and short answer questions. In the writing part, students write an academic composition. In the speaking part, students attend a face-to-face interview.

English Medium Programs

- Students who score 75 and above are exempt from English Support Program courses. The Department of English Language Teaching (ELT) applies different scales regarding the EMU Language Test. Students are advised to contact the ELT Department for specific rules and regulations.
- Students who score between 60 74, are placed into ENGL515.
- Students who score less than 60 are placed into ENGL513.

Turkish Medium PhD Programs

- Students who score 70 and above are exempt from English Support Program courses.
- Students who score between 60 69, are placed into ENGL515.
- Students who score less than 60 are placed into ENGL513.



Turkish Language Requirement

For master's and PhD programs that are taught in Turkish, evidence of Turkish language ability is required from international applicants. If you do not have a valid Turkish language qualification that meets the EMU requirements, your level will be assessed by examination at EMU. Based on the result, students may need to follow the Turkish Language Support program. In addition, English Language is required from all students who will register for Turkish taught PhD programs. The semesters in which students take **only** deficiency and English/Turkish Support Support Program courses, are not included in the maximum duration allowed to complete the given graduate program.


The deficiency courses must be completed in one academic year.
